Plastics International has prepared the following statement regarding compliance to the European Union Restriction of Hazardous Substances (RoHS).

The European Union (EU) RoHS 2 status is declared per directive 2011/65/EU. The Restriction of the Use of Certain Hazardous Substances in Electrical and Electronic Equipment (RoHS) Directive bans the use of four metals and two flame retardants in electronic products sold in Europe.

The RoHS Directive strictly bans the use of six hazardous materials. The materials are four metals: lead, cadmium, hexavalent chromium, and mercury; and two brominated flame retardants: polybrominated biphenyls (PBB) and polybrominated diphenyl ethers (PBDE).

In addition, as of July 2019 the EU RoHS 3 status is declared per directive 2015/863/EU to amend Annex II (Directive 2011/65/EU) to add the following 4 phthalates onto the list of restricted substances: Bis(2-Ethylhexyl) phthalate (DEHP), Benzyl butyl phthalate (BBP), Dibutyl phthalate (DBP), and Diisobutyl phthalate (DIBP).

This bulletin is to certify that, to the best of our knowledge, materials sold by Plastics International do not have any of the substances intentionally added during the manufacturing process. In addition, we would not expect the total of any of these substances to exceed 100 PPM.
